In the books of Master Henry Depont deceased, Elizabeth Barry Berry of Lower Dorset Street in the City of Dublin deposited, maketh oath and saith she knew and was intimately acquainted with Master Henry Berry of Rutland Square in the City of Dublin and with her character and means of handwriting having often seen his will, her name, both she hath carefully viewed, perused and examined the paper writing hereto annexed purporting to be and contain the said Will and Testament of the said deceased the same beginning "In the name of God Amen, I Henry Berry do hereby" and ending "this 24th of November 1842 Truly mine and intended" and hereto and to the said Will she hath carefully viewed and examined the name and words "A. Berry" written in pencil on the thirteenth line from the top of the third page of said Will and saith that the said words are of the proper hand-writing of said deceased to the best of her private knowledge, judgment and belief. That Depont saith that on the day next after the death of the said deceased viz on the 22nd day of October last past Depont found the coat of drawers in the upper drawer of which she said deceased usually kept her valuable papers and of which she the deponent always kept the key for the purpose of sending the said Will when upon this deponent did open said coat and then find the said Will sealed up in the envelope hereto annexed and with deceased own seal, saith that in about a quarter of an hour after the said will was so found by Depont the said Henry was broken by Doctor Thomas Holley one of the Executors thereof in presence of Depont and of the Reverend Thomas Russell Bishop and a Barry brother the wife and a Barry brother the daughter and of A. Berry deponent's brother and Doctor Lene. That that immediately on breaking the said seal the said Will was inspected by several of the said parties and by Depont and this deponent saith that at the time the said seal was opened and the said seal so broken the two words and name "A. Berry" were then contained thereon as they now appear in pencil and with the said Will is given in the foregoing full and condition as before the foregoing and was broken and the said Will so taken out by the said Doctor Thomas Holley.
