Know all men by these presents that our most beloved Son the King in His especial Letters under the Great Seal of Great Britain bearing date the first day of January in the fifth year of our said Son's Majesty did give unto Sir Thomas Drommond Baron of Drommond and Viscount of Drommond His especial Commandment that he should cause to be written and published in His Majesty's High Court of Chancery His Letters under the Great Seal of Great Britain in the said Letters bearing date the first day of January in the fifth year of our said Son's Majesty should contain the following tenors to wit James Drommond of the City of Dublin Gent: personally demanded against Thomas Sterling Esq: five hundred Messuages ten hundred Cottages ten hundred Pounds fifty Ormonds twenty Mills ten thousand Acres of arable land two hundred Acres of Meadow two hundred Acres of Pasture one hundred Acres of Wood and Underwood two hundred Acres of Furze and Scrub eight hundred Acres of Moor Marsh and Bog with the appurtenances in all that and those the Town and Land of Drommond otherwise Drommond otherwise Drommond situate lying and being in the County of Down aforesaid and the Right and Jurisdiction and into which the said Thomas hath not Entry until after the Dissein which James Drommond took of unjustly and without Judgment made to the said James within twenty Year now last past and whereupon he says that he was seized of the said Tenement with the appurtenances in the said Tenement as of free and Right in the time of Peace in the time of the present Lord the King by taking the profits thereof to the value of soforth and whereupon and therefore he brings his Suit and soforth And the said Thomas personally came and defended his Right with and soforth and whereupon called to warranty Thomas Drommond Esquire of Drommond in the County of Down summoned in the said County set him there in fifteen days from the day of point Martin by the aid of the Court the same day is given to the said parties and soforth at which day came there as well the said James as the said Thomas Sterling personally and the said Thomas Drommond being summoned and soforth also came by William Abbott his Attorney and freely warranted the said Tenement with the appurtenances to him and soforth and whereupon the said James demanded against the said Thomas Drommond tenant by his warranty the said Tenement with the appurtenances in form aforesaid and soforth and whereupon he says that he was seized of the said Tenement with the appurtenances in the said Tenement as of free and Right in the time of Peace in the time of the present Lord the King by taking the profits thereof to the value of soforth and whereupon and therefore he brings his Suit and soforth And the said Thomas Drommond tenant by his warranty defended his Right with

soforth and thereupon further called to warranty, James Johnston was id
personally present and in court and freely warranted the said Tenements with the appurtenances to him &
soforth and thereupon the P. James Daisett demanded against the P. James Johnston tenant by said
warranty the P. Tenements with the appurtenances in form aforesaid and soforth and whereupon he said
that he was seized of the P. Tenements with the appurtenances in his right and of his and his right in the
time of peace in the time of the present Lord the King by taking the said lands to the value and

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soforth and whereupon and soforth and thereupon he brought his suit and soforth. **And** the said James
Johnston tenant by said warranty defended his right versus soforth and said that the P. Daisett
did not dispossess the P. James Daisett of the P. Tenements with the appurtenances as the P. James Daisett by
his said writ and declaration doth above suppose and of this he put himself upon the

County and soforth. **And** the said James Daisett prayed leave to suspend and he gave it &
soforth and afterwards the said James Daisett came again personally into court in this
same term and the said James Johnston tho' solemnly required came not again but departed
in contempt of the court and made default. **Wherefore it is Considered** that the said James

Daisett do recover against the said Thomas Sterling full seisin of the said Tenements with the
appurtenances and that the said Thomas Sterling have of the said of the said Thomas Dismore
to the value and soforth and that the said Thomas Dismore further have of the said of
the said James Johnston to the value and soforth and the said James Johnston inillery and
soforth and thereupon the said James Daisett prayed a writ of the Lord the King to be
directed to the Sheriff of the King's County aforesaid to cause full seisin of the said
Tenements with the appurtenances to be delivered to him and it is granted to him &
returnable here on the octave of Saint Hilary at which day came here the said

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personally and the Sheriff Thomas Dismore by his writ directed on the twenty-fourth day of December
last past caused full seisin of the said Tenements with the appurtenances to be
delivered to the said James Daisett as by the said writ he was commanded. **All**
and singular we've promised at the request of the said James Daisett by the Tenor of
these presents we have commanded to be exemplified. **In Testimony** whereof we

have caused our seal appointed for sealing writs in our said Court to be
eranted affixed. **Witness** Joan Dow Dismore at the King's Court the third day of
July in the fifty first year of our Reign.
