This Indenture

of three parts made the first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six - Between William Bullock of Orakei Shoolund Marquis Lake, Upper Canada in North America as foined in the City of Dublin and Brandon of Ireland Esquire, Notary Law of the Royal Society

and purpose have been made and executed, that a bond should be forthcoming, to make legal and effectual payment of the sum of one thousand eight hundred and twenty dollars, for the removal of the body of said James Hommelink, to the town of New York, upon the first day of January next, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one. — And whereas the said William H. Clark has agreed to make such payment, and to pay the sum of two hundred and twenty dollars, to the wife of the said James Hommelink, to defray her expenses in the removal of his body, and to pay the expenses of the said James Hommelink, both agreed to and confirmed by the present of the said William H.
